## Gifts Through Your Will or Revocable Trust

You can make a bequest to support DC Central Kitchen by leaving all or some of your estate to DC Central Kitchen in your will or revocable trust. Bequests allow you to retain control of your assets now while making a significant gift in the future. You can modify your bequest at any time to accommodate changes in your life circumstances.

To include DC Central Kitchen in your will, you will need DC Central Kitchen's Tax ID number and address, which can be found in the sample language below. Please consult with your estate attorney to add this information to your will.

## To give a portion or the residuary of your estate:

I hereby give, devise and bequeath [all or a specified percentage] of the rest, residue, and remainder of my estate to DC Central Kitchen, a nonprofit corporation organized and existing under the laws of the District of Columbia, and with current business address of 425 Second Street NW, Washington, DC 20001, to be used for its general purposes.

## Gifts Through Your Retirement or Life Insurance Plan

You can make a gift to DC Central Kitchen by listing DC Central Kitchen as a beneficiary of your life insurance policy or retirement plan, including your 401K, 403B, or Individual Retirement Account (IRA). You can designate DC Central Kitchen receive all or a portion of your assets, and you may change your designation at any time should your circumstances change.

To name DC Central Kitchen as a beneficiary, notify your plan administrator that you'd like to change the beneficiary on your account. This can often be done through a simple beneficiary designation form available on your plan administrator's website. You'll need DC Central Kitchen's address and Tax ID, which is listed below:
